IMPROVING HEALTHCARE FOR COLORADO'S YOUTH

2026 Annual Conference

Call for Session Proposals

Youth Healthcare Alliance's annual conference brings together school-based clinic providers, managers, staff, and partners to learn with and from each other. Our 2026 conference will be held in-person in Denver, Colorado on April 28-29, 2026. It presents an opportunity for those working at the intersection of healthcare and education to network, collaborate, and increase skills.

This year's theme is "Rewriting the Story: Improving the Landscape of Colorado Youth Healthcare," with the idea in mind that the uncertainty in the healthcare system as we know it provides an opportunity to assess strengths and needs, find creative solutions, and center SBHCs in the narrative. This conference will allow us to unpack many of these different issues, while recognizing that we have the capability to seize opportunities and manage change effectively.

We are seeking speakers to present 60-minute sessions on topics connected to the conference theme that relate to the work and needs of school-based clinics and the youth they serve. We encourage submissions that include school-based clinic staff and youth perspectives and will give priority to presenters who are new to sharing at our conference. If you have presented at this conference within the past three years, please ensure this year's proposal is distinct from the topics you have previously covered. We are especially interested in sessions focused on the topics below, which our membership has expressed interest in learning more about this year.

- Collaborating with schools on alternatives to discipline
- Strategies for addressing vaping and/or marijuana use
- Integrating oral health education and prevention into primary care visits
- Suicide prevention in primary care and integrated care settings
- Current school-linked models of care in Colorado (e.g., pop-up clinics, telehealth hub and spokes, mobile clinics)

New this year, YHA will also be organizing 90-minute interactive, multi-presenter workshops on additional topics and will be recruiting presenters for those through individual outreach.
